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INTRODUCTION

- 1. WOMEN COME TO THE TOMB, BUT DISBELIEVED THE RESURRECTION (16:1-8)
 - (16:1–3) Women came early to finish preparing Jesus for burial, wondering about the stone
 - (16:4-5) They discover that the stone had been rolled away, saw an angel, and feared
 - (16:6-7) The angel told them not to fear (because Jesus arose) and to tell disciples
 - (16:8) The women feared and told no one (that Christ was raised)

The women told the disciples that someone had taken Christ's body (per John 20:2)

IS MARK 16:9-20 REALLY PART OF THE BIBLE? YES!

Textual critics who are overly impressed with a (Aleph) and B (Vaticanus) reject these verses because their two favorite mss omit these verses. Virtually no other mss omit 16:9-20.
