

Immanuel

Matthew 1:23 often appears on Christmas cards. Believers the world over recognize it as fulfillment of what was then Isaiah's 700+ year-old Messianic prophecy in Isaiah 7:14: Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel.

Unfortunately, skeptics found a way to cause many to doubt that Isaiah predicts a future virgin-birth. Specifically, they ask, "How would a birth 700 years later (after Ahaz died) persuade him?" Good question, but the bigger issue is: "Was Ahaz actually the intended audience of the prophecy?"

Many will be shocked to learn that he was not. The sign was for others, for the entire house of David (David's dynasty). Hundreds of years later Luke 1:27 and 2:4 say that Joseph, Jesus' adoptive father, was of the house of David. Thus, the following translation of Isaiah 7:10-14 distinguishes singular referents (Ahaz and you) from plural ones (House of David and y'all) by adding a superscripted ^S for singular or ^P for plural.

Moreover the LORD spoke again to Ahaz^s, saying, "Ask^s a sign for yourself^s from the LORD your^s God; ask it either in the depth or in the height above."

But Ahaz^s said, "I will not ask, nor will I test the LORD!"

Then he [Isaiah] said, "Hear now, O house" of David! Is it a small thing for y'all" to weary men, but will you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord Himself will give y'all" a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel."

Note that the first and second paragraphs use the singular you (referring to Ahaz). By contrast

the third paragraph utilizes y'all (referring to the house of David). This changes everything.

Isaiah did not announce a sign for Ahaz, but for the house of David, a plural group. The typical objection to Isaiah prophesying Messiah's birth disappears, because context does not demand that the sign occur during the lifetime of Ahaz.

Now, a closer investigation of the term Immanuel (God with us) is warranted. While in the wilderness God was present with Israel via the pillar of cloud and the pillar of fire (Exod 13:21-22; 33:14-16). The Davidic Covenant speaks of God's continuing presence with the Davidic kings (2 Sam 7:9, 13-15). However, although God would not abandon Israel, He warned that rebellion could cause Him to withdraw His presence (Num 14:9; Deut 31:17b). Thus, they would face military losses. In Ezekiel 10, the glory departed; God was not with them. Soon, Babylon subjugated Judah.

Isaiah 7 offered the nation hope. A virgin (certainly one from the house of David) would give birth to a Son, about whom it could rightly be said, "God is with us." Certainly, Old Testament people pondered Isaiah 7:14's meaning. However, Jesus' birth should have awakened the nation. People should have eagerly hung onto all that Immanuel (God with us) said. Not so during His first advent, but the nation will do so—when He returns to establish His Millennial Kingdom.
