Response: The Son obeys what the Father shows Him; doing even greater things (5:19-20)					
Like the Father, the Son resurrects and grants [everlasting] life to whom He wishes (5:21)					
The Father has delegated all judgment to the Son, so all would honor Him as they should honor the Father (5:22-23)					

They asked who healed him, but he did not know (5:12-13)

5:24-25 Believers have right now;
Believers will not come into [the G.W.T.];
Believers
Believing the Father is tantamount to believing the Son, because the Son speaks the Father's words. ¹
Verse 25 reiterates verse 24. Interpretation of an hour is coming and is now here. [This is not synonymous with an hour is coming (5:28)]
The Son has life in Himself [to give] just as the Father has life in Himself [to give] (5:26)

[Besides giving the Son the right to give life] the Father has given Him the right to judge (5:27)

bottom line is that one always believes a <u>person</u> for **content** that he/she has communicated. In John 5:24 the Father speaks the same content about the Son that the Son would speak.

5:28-29 discuss the great white throne, which occurs right after the 1000-year Millennium We must ask: "Which people are discussed in verses 28 and 29."

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- Revelation 20:4b-6a indicates that the second resurrection occurs after the Millennium. Only unbelievers are resurrected in the second resurrection.
- All believers will have been resurrected prior to the second resurrection:

 And they [resurrected tribulation martyrs] lived and reigned with

 Christ for a thousand years. (But the rest of the dead [unbelievers]

 did not live again until the thousand years were finished.) This is

 the first resurrection. Blessed and holy is he who has a part in the

 first resurrection. Over such the second death has no power...
