Two Key Passages: John 3:14-16 and Revelation 20:14:

John 3₁₄ "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, even so the Son of Man must be lifted up, ₁₅so whoever believes in Him <u>should not perish</u>, <u>but have everlasting life</u>. ₁₆ For God loved the world this way: That He gave His *One and* only Son, so whoever believes in Him <u>should not perish</u>, <u>but have everlasting life</u> [FMT: Faithful Majority Translation].

Revelation 20_{14} Then Death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is <u>the second</u> death, the lake of fire. [FMT]

QUESTION: When (in Relation to John 1) Would Jesus Have Been Baptized?

Possibility 1: The Day of John 1:29-35 Was Also the Day of His Baptism

Possibility 2: He Was Baptized Over 40 Days Prior to John 1:29-35

ANALYSIS: Where Did Jesus Go after Each Meeting with John the Baptist?

In John 1:37-42 (a new day) He accumulated some disciples. Then in John 1:43ff (a new day) He went to Galilee with disciples. Then in John 2:1-11 (three days later) He and disciples went to a wedding.
