(6:2-4)	N OF JOHN 6:2-14: THE SIGN CONVINCED SOME THAT JESUS IS THE MESSIAH Around Passover, a great crowd on shore followed Jesus to the place where Ho hore (around Bethsaida) and up the hillside.
	Jesus asked Philip where to buy food for all the people, to give him ar unity to anticipate a Messianic sign.

(6:7) Philip said that 8 months' wages could only buy a mouthful of bread for each one. A denarius was a day's wage for a common laborer 200 working days \approx 33 (six-day) weeks \approx 8 months wages. 8 months (at 3 meals per day) \approx 750 meals for one person.
There are 5,000 men (plus women & children—per Matthew 14:21) \approx 20,000 people Philip concludes that it is impossible to satisfy all of the people
(6:8-9) Andrew found a lad with 5 barley loaves & 2 fish (appetizers): A mere pitance.
(6:10) Jesus told His disciples to seat the people: They sat on the grass in groups of 50.
(6:11) Jesus gave thanks and began breaking bread the disciples gave everyone as much bread and fish as each wanted.

(6:12-13) After everyone was satisfied, Jesus sent each of the 12 with a basket, which they filled with leftover crumbs.

(6:14) The sign caused people to say that Jesus is the coming Prophet.

Reinforcement: Acts 3:22-26 Understands the Prophet Like Moses to Be the Messiah¹

²²"For Moses said to the fathers, '<u>The Lord our God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your brethren. Him you shall hear in all things, whatever He says to you. ²³And it shall be that every person who does not hear that Prophet shall be utterly destroyed from among the people.' ²⁴Indeed, all the prophets also (from Samuel and those afterward), as many as have spoken, have also announced these days. ²⁵You are sons of the prophets, and of the covenant which God made with our fathers, saying to Abraham, 'And in your seed all the families of the earth shall be blessed.' ²⁶To you first, God, having raised His Servant Jesus, sent Him to bless you, in turning away every one of you from your iniquities."</u>

Conclusion

¹ The fact that the religious leaders asked John the Baptist whether he would identify himself as either the Christ or the prophet (John 1:25) does not constitute proof that they regarded the Prophet to be distinct from the Christ. Why not? They were on a fishing expedition, using any term to see if John would embrace it. For example, a little child might say, "Fido is gone," while crying. We might ask, "Is Fido your dog?" Receiving no answer, we might ask, "Is Fido your doggie?" Still no answer, so we ask, "Is Fido your puppy?" Fido sounds more like a dog's name than one for a cat, so we may try several before we find the vocabulary term with which the child is familiar.

However, let us assume that the religious leaders in John 1 distinguished the Christ from the Prophet. Even if they did, this does not tell us that the people in John 6:14 made such a distinction.

The fact that John repeatedly shows that Jesus is the greater-than-Moses Prophet-like-Moses causes me to conclude that these people believed in Jesus as the Messiah.
