10/11 saw Him the night after He arose (20:19-23); all Eleven a week later (20:24-29)

Peter Urges Six Disciples to Fish with Him; Alone They Catch Nothing All Night (21:2-5)


Jesus Told Them to Cast on the Right Side of the Boat; They Had a Miraculous Catch (21:6-11)

They Ate Breakfast with Jesus: His Third Post-Resurrection Appearance to Them (21:12-14)

Jesus Asks Peter Three Times if He Loves Him; Peter Responds Affirmatively Three Times; Jesus Urges Peter to Minister to His Sheep and Lambs (21:15-17)

Why did Jesus ask the question three times?

Phileō and agapaō can have different emphases, but considerable overlap exists



John 20:15-17 does not imply that *phileō* is inferior to *agapaō*. Consider the following:

5:20 The Father (phileō) loves the Son

11:3, 36 Jesus loved (phileō) Lazarus

16:27 the Father loves (*phileō*) the Eleven, because they love (*phileō*) the Son

20:2 Jesus loved (*phileō*) John the apostle and in 19:26 He loved him (*agapaō*)
