Response at the Capernaum synagogue (after walking on the water) (6:22–71)

Discerning the point in John when Jesus was at the synagogue

Jesus said these things while teaching at a synagogue in Capernaum (6:59)

Many interpreters think the start of <u>these things</u> is at verse 41, but that is not a good starting point, because Judeans grumble there because of verses 35–38

The best starting point for these things is at 6:22. In other words, the crowds that went looking for Jesus found Him *teaching in a synagogue at Capernaum*.

Clearly, this Capernaum synagogue could not hold 10,000+ people

Those who came by boat had been fed could not figure out how Jesus got there after feeding them

Others present in the synagogue were locals
