Ephesians: Message 3 (Blessing the Father for our Trinity-Wrought Inheritance)

Recipients: The church at Ephesus

Date: Late within Paul's first Roman imprisonment (February 60–March 62): Probably 61.

Defining We versus You in Ephesians

You always is limited to Gentiles, we always includes Jews.

However, we can be exclusively Jews or can refer to the Church (which includes Jews)

Structure of Ephesians 1:3-14 (longest Greek sentence in the NT. I punctuate it as one sentence).

- (A) Gentile Bels ought to bless the Father who richly blessed <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:3);
 - (B) by Father's <u>praiseworthy work</u>: <u>preparing</u> inheritance of <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:4-6);
 - (C) by Christ's <u>praiseworthy work</u>: <u>procuring</u> inheritance of <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:7-12);
 - (D) by Spirit's <u>praiseworthy work</u>: <u>protecting</u> inheritance of <u>Gentile/Jewish</u> bels (1:13f).

Ephesians mentions the Trinity in one sentence in other passages, too: e.g., 2:18, 22; 3:14-16; 4:4-6.

NEW EXPOSITION:

1:3 Gentile Bels ought to bless the Father who richly blessed <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u>

1:4-6

(A) Gentile Bels ought to bless the Father who richly blessed <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:3); (B) by Father's <u>praiseworthy work</u>: <u>preparing</u> inheritance of <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:4-6);

What is the nature of the election of *US* discussed in Ephesians 1:4?

When did it occur? Before the foundation of the world = before the earth _____

What is the time frame for people "to be holy and blameless before Him in love"?

What is the result of this election? Predestination to placement as sons (*huio* + *thesia*)

This is a term for putting a son (even one's own biological son) in a will.

cf. 1:11: we have obtained an allotment, because of being placed as sons cf. 1:14 who is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession

How should believers respond to what the Father did? To the praise of the glory of His grace

1:7-12:

(A) Gentile Bels ought to bless the Father who richly blessed <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:3);
 (B) by Father's <u>praiseworthy work</u>: <u>preparing</u> inheritance of <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:4-6);
 (C) by Christ's <u>praiseworthy work</u>: <u>procuring</u> inheritance of <u>Jewish</u> believers <u>first</u> (1:7-12);
 He redeemed & forgave OUR transgressions through His blood according to the riches of His grace (1:7)

He has poured out grace upon *US* in willingly making known the mystery of His will (1:8-9a)

Chapter 3 details the mystery

His will is going to culminate in the dispensation which culminates the ages—in which everything will be placed under Christ's headship (1:10)

Besides everything being put under Christ's headship, **WE** received an allotment in Him, because [the Father] predestined **US** [to placement as sons—inheritance: cf. 1:5] in accordance w/ the purpose of Him who does all things according to His will (1:11)

The purpose of everything being placed under Christ's headship and us receiving an allotment is so that **WE**—the first to hope in Christ—would praise the Father's glory (1:12)
