INTRODUCTION

GENESIS 1:26

God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness..."

The Hebrew word here for "God," 'Ĕlōhîm (Elohim) is plural (-îm is a plural ending).

I will render this ultra-literally as GODS (but am referring to the One Triune God)

However, the verb "said" is a singular form.

Whether one says he said or they said (in English), the word "said" does not inflect (change). However, if we retranslate "said" as has said, this issue will be clear.

Has said is a singular form: cf. he has said (we do not say, "they has said")

Have said is a plural form: cf. they have said (we do not say, "he have said")

An ultra-literal translation would be: GODS has said.

(Note that although the subject is a plural form, the verb "has said," is singular.)

Now, if the Hebrew were speaking about false gods, it would say: gods have said (Note that both the subject and the verb "have said," are plural.)

GENESIS 1:27

Notice here that God (*Elohim*) created man in His image. We can say (using the conventions of the prior section: GOD<u>S</u> has created man in His image...
