Introduction

Casting Lots for His Clothes (19:23-24)

23 So when the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took His garments and made four parts, a part for each soldier, also the tunic. Now the tunic was seamless, woven from the top throughout.

²⁴ So they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it, whose it will be," so the Scripture [Psalm 22:18] might be fulfilled, which says: «They divided My garments among themselves, And for My clothing they cast a lot.» So the soldiers did these *things*.

See Your Mother (19:25-27)

₂₅ Now His mother, and His mother's sister *in law*, Mary the *wife* of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala were standing by the cross of Jesus.

₂₆ So, seeing His mother and the disciple whom He loved standing, Jesus told His mother, "Ma'am, see your son."

₂₇ Then He told the disciple, "See your mother." And from that hour the disciple welcomed her into his home.

The Father's Work Is Complete (19:28-30)

₂₈ After this, Jesus seeing that everything had now been completed, said (so the Scripture might be completed) "I thirst."

²⁹ So a vessel full of sour wine was setting, and they filled a sponge with sour wine, put hyssop around it, and held it to His mouth.

₃₀ So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "My Father's work is complete." And bowing His head, He delivered up His spirit.

A Soldier Pierces Jesus' Side (19:31-37)

₃₁ Therefore Judean *leaders* asked Pilate that their legs might be broken and they might be removed, so the bodies might not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day, since it was preparation *day*).

- $_{32}$ So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and of the other who was crucified with Him.
- 33 But when they came to Jesus, they did not break His legs, when they saw He was already dead.
- 34 But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and at once blood and water came out.
- 35 Now he who saw this has testified (and his testimony is true, and he knows he speaks true things), so you• may believe.
- ₃₆ For these *things* happened so the Scripture would be fulfilled: «Not a bone of Him will be broken.»
- 37 And again another Scripture says: «They will look unto Him whom they had pierced.»

Joseph and Nicodemus (19:38-42)

- ₃₈ After these *things*, Joseph from Arimathea (who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of Judean *leaders*) asked Pilate that he might remove Jesus' body and Pilate consented. So he came and removed Jesus' body.
- 39 Now Nicodemus who (the first time) had come to Jesus at night, also came, bringing a mixture of about seventy-five pounds of myrrh and aloe.
- ⁴⁰ So they took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with aromatic spices in linen *cloths*, as is the burial custom for Judeans.
- 41 Now in the place where He was crucified was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one yet had been buried.
- 42 So they put Jesus there (because of the Judean Preparation Day), since the tomb was nearby.

Conclusion
