Prologue summarizing Luke Acts 1:1-3

- I. The Church is born in Jerusalem to challenges within and without Acts 1:4-6:7
- II. Opposition forces the Church to expand from Jerusalem Acts 6:8-9:31
- III. Peter Passes the Baton to Paul Acts 9:32-12:24
- IV. Paul's Ministry is Born Acts 12:25-16:5
- V. Paul's Ministry Expands 16:6-19:20
- VI. Paul Carried the Message of Christ to Rome 19:21-28:31

Note: Zane Hodges breaks the book of Acts into six panels: Acts 1:4-6:7 as Panel 1, Acts 6:8-9:31 as Panel 2, Acts 9:32-12:24 as Panel 3, Acts 12:25-16:5 as Panel 4, Acts 16:6-19:20 as Panel 5, Acts 19:21-28:31 as Panel 6.

Booklet 2 contains three major sections (3 stories)

- A. Stephen's Mission (3 events) 6:8-8:3
 - 1. The Freedmen accused Stephen of blasphemy 6:8-15
 - 2. Stephen rebuked Israel for rejecting God's agents 7:1-53
 - 3. Stephen's death and other persecution scattered the church 7:54-8:3
- B. Philip's Mission (3 events) 8:4-40
 - 1. Philip evangelized to the Samaritans 8:4-13
 - 2. Peter and John ministered to the Samaritans 8:14-25
 - 3. Philip expanded his territory of evangelism 8:26-40
- C. Paul's Conversion (3 events) 9:1-31
 - 1. God chose Saul to be His agent 9:1-18
 - 2. Paul preached Jesus is the Christ in the synagogues 9:19-22
 - 3. The Jews failed to stop Paul preaching Jesus is Christ and the church grew 9:23-31

The charges against Stephen were that he spoke blasphemous words against the temple and law!

Stephen's theme is Israel always resists the Holy Spirit regardless of which generation 7:51

Stephen insightfully explained that Israel and its forefathers consistently rejected God's agents:

Abraham partially rejected God's agent (Angel of the Lord)

1.	Jacob's	sons	rejected	Joseph	twice
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- 2. Israel rejected Moses twice
- 3. The "council" rejected Jesus (the Prophet greater than Moses)

eph	en responded (in three cycles) 2-53
1.	Deliverance from trouble (famine) in the patriarchal period by God's chosen savior (Joseph), whom the patriarchs rejected 2-16
2.	Deliverance from trouble (slavery) in the Egyptian period by God's chosen savior (Moses), whom Israel rejected 17-43
3.	Deliverance from trouble (persecution) in the Church-Expansion period to the kingdom by God's chosen Savior (Jesus), whom the JLs (council) rejected 44-53
