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INTRODUCTION

STATISTICS IN JOHN'S GOSPEL:

John's Gospel has *pisteuō* ("believe") 100 times (Majority Text; 98 times Nestle-Aland). John's Gospel has *metanoeō* ("repent") zero times and has *metanoia* ("repentance") zero times.

WE WILL TEST THEORIES (The response to the following two THEORIES will be the same): THEORY 1: REPENTANCE IS IMPLICIT IN THE WORD BELIEVE:

THEORY 2: REPENTANCE IS AN UNSTATED CONDITION FOR ETERNAL LIFE IN JOHN:

ANSWER 1 TO THEORIES 1 AND 2:

JOHN, THE ONLY NT BOOK WRITTEN TO PERSUADE UNBELIEVERS OF THE MESSAGE OF LIFE DOES NOT MENTION REPENTANCE, BUT BOOKS WRITTEN TO BELIEVERS DO MENTION IT.

THE 12 USES OF METANOEŌ ("REPENT") METANOIA ("REPENTANCE") IN REVELATION:

Pertaining to Believers

- 1-2. Remember therefore from where you have fallen; <u>repent</u> and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place— unless you <u>repent</u>. (2:5)
- 3. Repent, or else I will come to you quickly and will fight against them with the sword of My mouth. (2:16)
- 4-6. And I gave her time to <u>repent</u> of her sexual immorality, and she did not <u>repent</u>. Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, unless they <u>repent</u> of their deeds. (2:21-22)
- 7. Remember therefore how you have received and heard; hold fast and <u>repent</u>. Therefore if you will not watch, I will come upon you as a thief, and you will not know what hour I will come upon you. (3:3)
- 8. As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten. Therefore be zealous and repent. (3:19)

Pertaining to Unbelievers

- 9-10. But the rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, did not <u>repent</u> of the works of their hands, that they should not worship demons, and idols of gold, silver, brass, stone, and wood, which can neither see nor hear nor walk. And they did not <u>repent</u> of their murders or their sorceries or their sexual immorality or their thefts. (9:20-21)
- 11. And men were scorched with great heat, and they blasphemed the name of God who has power over these plagues; and they did not **repent** and give Him glory. (16:9)
- 12. They blasphemed the God of heaven because of their pains and their sores, and did not **repent** of their deeds. (16:11)

ANSWER 2 TO THEORIES 1 AND 2:

THE NT REGULARLY LINKS ETERNAL LIFE TO BELIEVING (cf. John 3:16; 5:24; 6:47, etc). ONLY ONE PASSAGE (ACTS 11:18 LINKS METANOIA ("REPENTANCE") WITH LIFE. HOWEVER,

- 1. Acts 11:18 says life, not eternal life. The OT recognized that Gentiles can receive eternal life. Otherwise, the citation of Psalm 18:49; Deut 32:43; and Isaiah 11:10 in Romans 15:8-12 would make no sense. Life in Acts 11:18 does not refer to receiving eternal life. They were (Acts 11:2-3) concerned about ceremonial uncleanness of the Gentile believers, not with whether those Gentiles had eternal life.
- 2. Would anyone want to make a doctrine rest solely upon the "experts" who speak in Acts 11:18? This is especially true, when alternate interpretations exist.

ANSWER 3 TO THEORIES 1 AND 2:

JESUS GAVE THE MESSAGE OF LIFE FOR 6 MONTHS BEFORE FIRST PREACHING REPENTANCE:

Matthew, Mark, and John all treat the imprisonment of John the Baptist as an important chronological marker. The following summarizes each Gospel account's contribution:

John the Baptist preached repentance Compare Matt 3:2 and 4:17	Matthew 3:1-12	Mark 1:1-8	John —

TAKEAWAY: Jesus ministered w/o preaching repentance for six months after baptism.

Did He have an incomplete message?

ANSWER 4 TO THEORIES 1 AND 2:

IF REPENTANCE WAS NOT PART OF JESUS' MESSAGE BEFORE THE BAPTIST'S IMPRISONMENT, HOW SAFE IS IT TO ASSUME THAT IT WAS IMPLICIT OR UNDERSTOOD AFTERWARDS?

THE CORRECT MODEL: Eternal life comes through faith alone in Jesus Christ alone. Believers (individually) or the nation of Israel (collectively) will have harmony with God via repentance.	
Deuteronomy 30 requires Israel to repent, so they can be regathered to the Millennial Isra and the kingdom.	ael
John the Baptist (Matt 3:2) and Jesus (Matt 4:17) linked repentance to coming of the Millennial kingdom
