Exposition:

The Servant-King (13:1-11)

¹ Now before the Feast of Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come to depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world) loved them unto *the* end.

² And after dinner was *served* (the devil already having put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's *son*, that he should betray Him), ³ since Jesus knew that the Father had given to Him everything into His hands, and that He had come forth from God and was going to God),

⁴ He rose from the dinner and put *His outer garment aside*. Then after taking a towel, He wrapped it around Himself.

⁵ Then He put water into a basin and began washing the disciples' feet and drying *them* with the towel which He was wrapped.

⁶ So He came to Simon Peter. And he said to Him, "Lord, do You wash my feet?"

⁷ In reply Jesus said to him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but after these *things* you will understand."

⁸ Peter told Him, “You will never wash my feet, not ever.” Jesus answered him, “Unless I wash you, you do not have a share with Me.”

⁹ Simon Peter said to Him, “Lord, not only my feet, but also my hands and my head.”

¹⁰ Jesus told him, “*One* who has bathed has no need except for his feet to be washed, but he is all clean. And you• are clean, though not everyone *is*.”

¹¹ For He knew the *one* betraying Him. Thus He said, “You• are clean, *though* not everyone *is*.”

Do You Know What I Have Done for You? (13:12-20)

¹² So when He had washed their feet and had taken His outer garment, reclining again He said to them, “Do you• know what I have done for you•?”

¹³ “You• call Me ‘Teacher’ and ‘Lord,’ and you• speak well, since I am. ¹⁴ “So if I, the Lord and the Teacher, have washed your• feet, you• also ought to wash one another’s feet.

¹⁵ “For I have given you• an example, so you• also should do as I have done for you•. ¹⁶ “Amen, amen, I tell you•, a slave is not greater *than* his master, nor is an apostle greater *than* the *One* who sent him.

¹⁷ “If you• know these *things*, blessed are you• if you• do them.

¹⁸ “I do not speak about all of you•. I know *those* whom I chose, but so the Scripture may be fulfilled: «The *one* who eats bread with Me has raised his heel against Me.»

¹⁹ “From now *on* I tell you• before *something* happens, so when it happens, you• may believe that I am *He*.

²⁰ “Amen, amen, I tell you•, the *one* who receives anyone I send receives Me, and the *one* who receives Me receives Him who sent Me.”
